Unique skin care move

The recent arrival of new skin care analysis equipment has seen a Thorndon skin care clinic become world leaders in their field.

Advanced skin care specialists skin therapy is the first clinic in New Zealand to offer the new VisioFace skin analysis machine and the first in the world to combine the machine with a VisioScope camera and software.

Skin therapy director Rachel Robertson says it is special for a little clinic like hers in Thorndon to be the first in the world to offer the combination of technology.

"We are big on being at the forefront of our industry and try to offer our clients the best service possible," the current New Zealand skin therapist of the year says.

She says the new \$10,000 technology

imported from Germany and Switzerland will enable more detailed skin analysis looking at pores, depth of wrinkles, levels of pigmentation, skin texture, unevenness and homogeneity.

3D imaging of the skin can displayed on a monitor and areas can be magnified up to 500 times to look for skin damage or abnormalities with the data being great for recommendations sent to dermatologists, she says.

She says the response from clients towards the new technology has been fantastic.

"We have only had the machine four weeks but we can't wait to get clients back after treatment and show them their results using this technology. They love seeing those changes that they don't see on a daily basis."
